All comments so submitted that are received prior to 12:00 p.m. on the day of which the meeting is held will be read out loud during the discussion of the respective item(s) identified in the e-mail; comments without such identification shall be read during the public comments portion of the meeting.

All matters listed under **CONSENT CALENDAR** are considered as being routine by the Board of Directors and will be enacted by one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless requested by a Member of the Board of Directors or the public prior to the time the Board votes on the motion to adopt.

ADDRESSING THE BOARD ON AN ITEM ON THE AGENDA

Persons wishing to speak of **PUBLIC HEARINGS** and **OTHER MATTERS** listed on the agenda will be heard when the President calls for comments from the audience, except on public hearing items previously heard and closed to public comment. The President may specify the number of minutes each person will be permitted to speak based on the number of persons wishing to speak and the time available. After the public has commented, the item is closed to further public comments and brought to the Board for discussion and action. There is no further comment permitted from the audience unless invited by the Board.

ADDRESSING THE BOARD ON AN ITEM NOT ON THE AGENDA

In accordance with State law, the Board is prohibited from discussing items not calendared on the Agenda. You may only address the Board on an item not on the Agenda, and which are within their jurisdiction, under **PUBLIC COMMENTS**. The time allotted for this discussion shall be three (3) minutes, subject to reasonable modification by the Board President. Matters raised which are not on the Agenda may be referred to staff for action or calendared on a future Agenda.

7. OLD BUSINESS

A. <u>District Goals and Future Work Development Discussion (Discussion)</u>

The District Board and Administrative Staff will discuss current projects, District goals, future projects from all aspects of District Administration, Engineering, Capital Projects, Regulatory Development, and Prioritization.

8. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. <u>Nomination and Election of Officers for the Remainder of Calendar Year 2023 (Action)</u> At this time the Board of Directors will elect officers and select committees for the remainder of the calendar year after the sudden loss of President Connie Batchelder. B. <u>2023 Priority Improvements Bid Result and Proposed Project Modifications (Discussion and action)</u> A Board decision is needed regarding the approach to the potential award of the construction contract for the 2023 Priority Improvements Project. The apparent low bid received on Tuesday May 30, 2023 was \$267,850, which was 76 percent higher than the Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost (Engineer's Estimate) of \$152,000.

Staff Recommendation (Motion Required):

- 1) Reject the 2023 Priority Improvements Project bid as it exceeds Engineer's Estimate.
- 2) Modify scope of work to remove spot repair for damaged caused by EBMUD water line installation.
- 3) Re-advertise on June 15, 2023 and re-bid on June 28, 2023.
- C. <u>SDRMA Board of Directors Election (Discussion and Action)</u>

The Special District Risk Management Authority has requested the Rodeo Sanitary District assist in the election of the SDRMA Board of Directors.

Staff Recommendation (Motion Required): Come to a consensus on three candidates and direct the District Manager to submit the official ballot to SDRMA.
